If you don't see me before, join the team for a post-festival drink and debrief in The Nook after the events on Sunday 23rd.

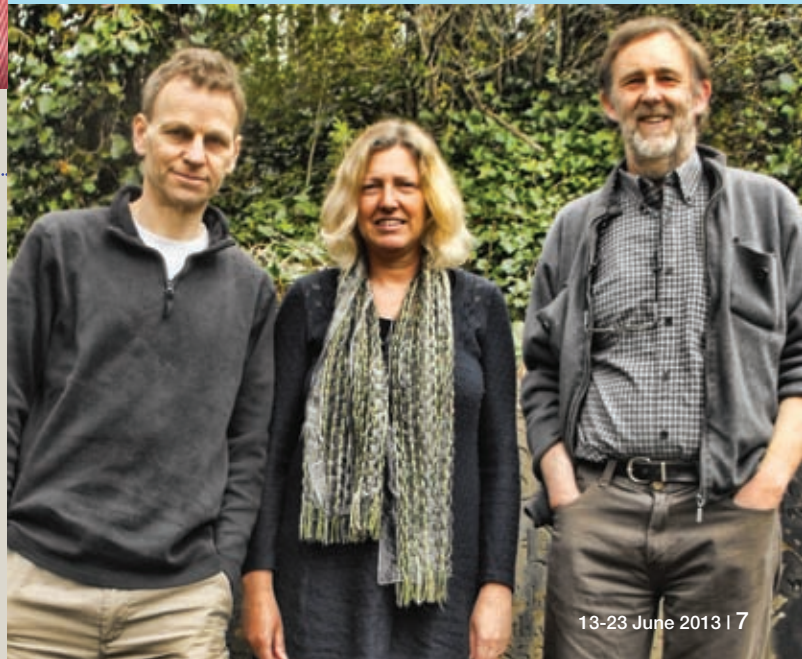

XueFei Yang - guitar

Born in Beijing, Xuefei (Fei) Yang is acclaimed as one of the world's finest classical guitarists. Growing up following the Cultural Revolution, she was the first ever guitarist in China to be awarded a full international scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music in London. Her debut in Madrid at the age of 14 was attended by the composer Joaquín Rodrigo and when John Williams heard her play he gave two of his own instruments to Beijing's Central Conservatoire especially for her and other advanced students. Now based in the UK, Fei has performed at the Wigmore Hall, South Bank Centre and Royal Albert Hall. In demand internationally on the concert stage in the USA, Europe and Asia, Fei has also made a number of award-winning recordings for EMI and has been named by Classic FM magazine as one of the 100 top classical musicians of our time. Her beautifully balanced recital programme for Holmfirth celebrates British music, with Britten in his anniversary year and Walton's scintillating Five Bagatelles, as well as the Mediterranean colours of de Falla and Tarrega. 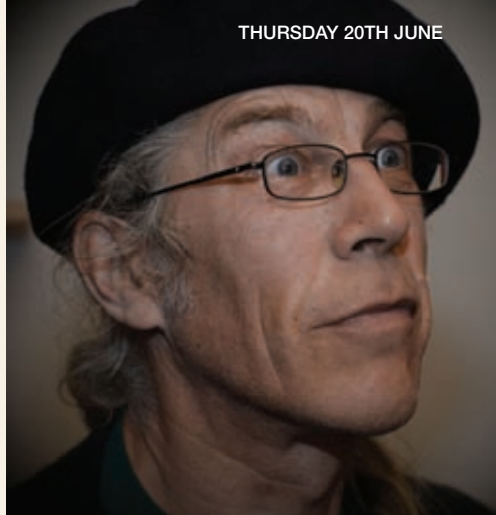

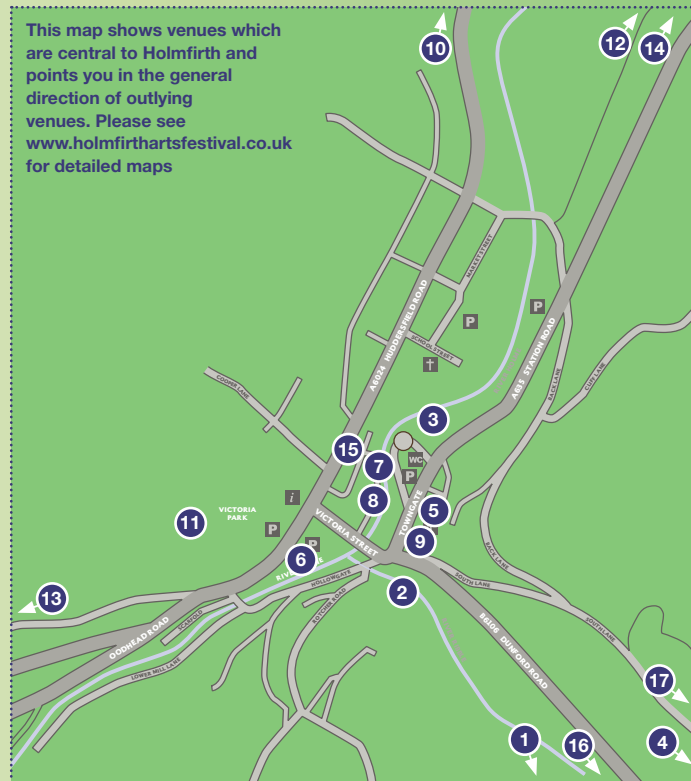
